To prepare for this journey, think about any plays or novels you have read. Consider how characters and settings are created using vocabulary and writing structures.

During your journey you will ...

1. Study a play and understand the features of a play.
2. Think about the meanings of 'trust.'
3. Watch a film version of the play and look at how characters are portrayed.
4. Look for words and phrases that are used to describe characters and settings.
5. Learn about accents and dialects and understand how people can be different.
6. Have a go at writing and performing your own brief mini play extract choosing effective vocabulary and punctuation to create meaning and character. The theme is 'trust' and can be a monologue, a duologue, or involve 3 characters maximum.
7. Use iPads to record, view and evaluate your performance.
8. Write a formal letter from Carol to Mr Briggs 10 years later, reflecting on the day out.
